

General Meeting 19 April 1962

Lakehead Amateur Radio Club

Pat O'Shea - VE3FW then made a motion to adjourn the business portion of the meeting which was seconded by Jack Read - VE3ECG and carried at 8:44 pm.

Following this a draw was made to see who was to visit the station of Frank Start - VE3AJ and it was won by David Lainq - VE3EDN.
