The Secretary has been asked to send a letter to the RSO asking them for a run down on their organization, with the possible thought in mind of affiliation.

Following the meeting, a short film was shown by Robert Browning - VE3EEM on the past year's Field Day and Les Harris - VE3AYZ showed a number of slides on past Field Days and Search and Rescue work. Two films were shown on SSB systems set up by Collins in the States and Norway.

Two full memberships and three associate memberships were sold during the meeting.

The meeting adjourned at 10:00 pm.
