

Lakehead Amateur Radio Club

Various sites were discussed, such as Frank's farm (VE3AJ) Kakabeka, Ray's camp (VE3EDZ) with the latter to be checked out by Ray Forslund - VE3EDZ and Bill Klemacki - VE3EEW. A report will be forthcoming at the May meeting.

An excellent tape was played by Bill Klemacki - VE3EEW on 10 metre beacons in Scotland with the narrator being GM3GUJ.

The meeting adjourned at 9:50 pm.

Following the meeting, the Club's new transceiver was on display, and put on the air. It looks as if we now have a nice piece of gear that actually belongs to the Lakehead Amateur Radio Club. A home-brew keyer was also displayed by Robert Browning - VE3EEM.

It must be mentioned here that the transceiver belongs to all the members of the Lakehead Amateur Radio Club, and any member in good standing, and holding the appropriate certificate, has the right to use this radio equipment. This also holds true for the DC power supply.
