

MINUTES

MEETING

JANUARY 14, 1971

The first meeting of the new year commenced at 8:10 pm January 14, 1971.

Present were 19 members and guests.

Following the usual rollcall. the Minutes of the previous meeting were read and accepted on a motion by Ray Forslund VE3EDZ and seconded by Hugh Elliott VE3EDW.

Publicity chairman, Ray Forslund, VE3EDZ mentioned three separate items that had appeared in the News-Chronicle. Ray indicated that he had handed in only one piece, so High-Q would seem to be the reason.

Membership chairman Pete Boyle VE3DPJ Showed the signs and letters to accompany them, that would schools regarding our approaching code classes. He also brought up the subject of QSL cards showing Thunder Bay highlights, and he would approach Jim Jessiman on this subject.

The Thunder Bay Award QSO party was set up for Sundays starting at 1800Z or 1300 EST on 14.170 MHz. Saturday schedules were also possible.

Code classes were scheduled to start on February at 7 P.M. and continuing until 8:30 P.M. classes would be held on Mondays and Wednesdays under instructors, Bill Klemacki VE3EEW Stan Chorley VE3ECR, Bill Roberts VE3ARN, Ray Forslund VE3EDZ and Les Harris VE3AYZ. The use of the South door would be investigated to avoid interference with other groups using the Building.

Club station, VE3ZCD would be fired up on at 7 P.M. by Les Harris VE3AYZ Bill Klemacki Bill Klemacki VE3EEW and Walt VE3EFI. Others were invited to participate.

Les Harris VE3AYZ, Emergency Co-ordinator for Thunder Bay then gave a rundown on the forthcoming Simulated Emergency Test set for January 30 and 31.

Pete Boyle VE3DPJ brought up a further idea on publicity by mentioning that Maclean-Hunter have facilities available for any interested group that may like to produce their own show, for cable T.V. It was unanimously supported and a committee was to be formed to do further planning.

There being no further business. the meeting adjourned at 10 P.M.
