A letter was read from EMO advising that unauthorized long-distance phone calls were being made from the EMO Building. It's hoped none of our members were involved in this.

Funds on hand to date were \$85.33.

An AC power supply being built by Ray Forslund - VE3EDZ was in need of about \$15.00 worth of parts, so Dr. George Clarke - VE3CUX moved that Ray be paid \$15.00 for the parts. This power supply should be the electrical equivalent of the HP-23, for the HW-12A.

It was moved that the Post Office Box be retained for another year at \$8.00.

Dr. George Clarke - VE3CUX announced that the Aurora Borealis Net was in full swing, but that more check-ins were needed from the Lakehead and vicinity to relay traffic east and west.

Frank Cupello of the Port Arthur Public Utilities Commission then led a question and answer period on electrical safety practices and Dr. George Clarke - VE3CUX gave a practical demonstration of mouth-to-mouth resuscitation. George urged all amateurs to learn the basics of this system, in case of electrical shock, primarily in our hobby, and as a method of saving lives in other circumstances.
